


FY 2022 Finances

The Northern Marians Technical Institute (NMTI), formerly known as Northern Marianas Trades Institute, was transitioned from a non-profit educational institute to a non-profit public corporation, as an autonomous agency effective February 8, 2021. CNMI Public Law 20-92 officially established the Northern Marianas Technical Institue on February 19, 2019, however, the transition did not occur until fairly recently partly due to the COVID-19 shutdown of the CNMI and other organizational circumstances.

NMTI contributes to the Commonwealth's education, workforce and economic development by providing advanced trades and technical education.
